

CONTACT YOUR LEGISLATOR ABOUT PUBLIC EDUCATION

LOOKING TO CONTACT your legislator but not sure how to get started? You're not alone, and right now your voice matters more than ever. Use the "[Find Your Legislator](#)" button on our home page to locate contact information and then consider reaching out to them using one (or more!) of the ideas below:

- How does your local public school make a positive impact in your community, even if you don't currently have a child enrolled in the system?
- Why should taxpayer funds go towards your local public school— which serves *all* children— instead of private schools?
- How is it a reinvestment to support strong public schools? Consider how our schools support local jobs, property values, workforce readiness, and public safety.
- What specific actions can your legislator take to better support the schools in your area? (smaller class sizes, more teachers, new supplies, improved safety, etc.)

Subject: Put Kids First! Support Our Public Schools

I respectfully ask that you support policies and budget decisions that strengthen public education and ensure that taxpayer dollars are used to support the schools that serve all the children of North Carolina.
